Trans X Istanbul is a personal documentary film and part of the multi-platform project Trans X Turkey about the human rights situation of Transgender people in Turkey.

Thousands of Trans\*women live in the big cities of Turkey. Since 2009 there has been an increase in the murder of Trans\*people. If crimes against Trans\*women are even investigated by the police and brought to court, the perpetrators can usually rely on being exempted from prosecution. Ebru, a Trans\*woman from Istanbul, who fights against the displacement and murder of her companions. She feels the pain because of her past experiences of exclusion from state, society and family in her own life.

The film 'I AM GAY AND MUSLIM' focuses on the subject of gay rights in the Islamic world. This intimate documentary follows a number of young gay Moroccan men in their exploration of their religious and sexual identity. Triggered by the current political situation in which homosexuality and the Islam seem irreconcilable, director Chris Belloni spent the major part of 2011 traveling in Morocco to interview gay Muslims. The men



portrayed in the film openly share their personal experiences and talk about the ambiguity and secretiveness of the life they feel condemned to live, although some have openly acknowledged their sexual orientation.

Mondial 2010 is a discussion of institutional borders in the modern day Middle East. A travel film in a trajectory that doesn't allow travel, shot with a handheld camcorder, Mondial 2010 borrows the aesthetics of a travel video

log. It normalizes the abnormal, and by doing so creates its own universe of possibility. It is a shift from the mainstream passive view of the Palestinian/Israeli conflict that places the victim/oppressor in the forefront of the produced imagery.
