Aks International Minorities festival is back in Copenhagen with an exceptional film and art program that will create space for the dialogues on issues impacting minorities such as racism, migration, asylum, minorities within minorites and the representation of queer, trans people of color (QTIBPOC).

Since 2015, the Danish edition of the Aks festival has focused on showing films and creating space for important debates on the topics that are often ignored by the mainstreams in Denmark. The festival is celebrating its fifth year in Copenhagen, once again we are fully motivated in creating spaces for conversations about marginalization and minorities. The festival will be held at Cinemateket from 5. Aug - 8 August with some extra pride screenings on 14th and 17th August. Apart from the screenings at the Cinemateket in Copenhagen, the festival will also organise film screenings and art exhibitions at other venues of World Pride 2021 and Frederiksberg Library. This year, we will also bring festivals to some other major cities in Denmark (Aarhus, Kolding and Odense).


Apart from the regular film screenings, Aks festival will organise performance art events, art exhibitions during the World Pride Week and we will bring several artists and activists from South West Asia and North Africa (SWANA) region.

The festival will use the unique medium of film and art to initiate public debates on the topics like racial profiling, art and activism, artistic freedom, racism, refugees and asylum processes.

#### ZINDAGI TAMASHA by SARMAD KHOSAT

Duration: 138 min, Country: Pakistan, Year: 2020, Language: Urdu, Punjabi with English subtitles
The title Zindagi Tamasha is inspired by a Lollywood classic sad song of the same name and is a
perfect match for the portrayal of the chaotic and unjust society in this film. Rahat, a devout Muslim
man, famous for singing hymns, takes care of his bedridden wife and is considered a pillar of support for his community. But he has a guilty pleasure - enjoying old Punjabi movies. At a wedding,
egged on by friends, he breaks into a dance paying homage to his film idols. The video of a bearded man dancing freely goes viral and Rahat's life begins to crumble as he is shunned by his family
and the wider community.

Sarmad Khosat's Zindagi Tamasha is a deeply affecting look at how society condemns those who refuse to fall in line and dare to express themselves freely.

Beside winning multiple international awards and being Pakistan's official entry to the Oscars, the film ended up in a controversy as the religious right wing accused it of being blasphemous. As a result, the film which actually tries to evoke dialogues on freedom of expression is suspended from all public screenings in Pakistan.

Event: The film will be digitally introduced by the director Sarmad Khosat live from Pakistan. After the film we will invite our local heroes to talk about Art and Freedom of Expression.

## PIER KIDS by ELEGANCE BRATTON


Pier Kids explores the lives of the Black, homeless queer and trans youth who call the Christopher Street Pier in New York City their home, forging friendships and chosen families. The documentary focuses the kids as they navigate their lives, withstanding homophobia and discrimination while working to carve out autonomy and security.

Director, Elegance Bratton's vérité camera plunges viewers into the midst of the chaos. Red and blue police lights flash in the corners of many frames, and interviewees speak to us on their level, their views and circumstances never prettied-up for easier consumption. What could come across is that the black queer community is suffering, but Bratton and the participants have let us past barriers to push our seeing further than the surface read. We can see that there is struggle in being houseless and resourceless, and there is also very strong friendship in the scene.

Event: The screening is accompanied by a conversation relating some of the central themes explored in the documentary to the Danish context.

## NAZ & MALIK by JAY DOCKENDORF

Jay Dockendorf's indie feature Naz & Maalik is about African-American teenage boys who also happen to be devout Muslims and queer. Naz and Maalik roam around the streets of Brooklyn, discuss their beliefs, Islam, the world, and their place in it. A lovers' quarrel and a search to find a chicken for slaughter adds levity to this touching and romantic portrait. However, when an undercover agent tries to sell them a gun, they are suddenly under investigation by the FBI. As they strain to hide their sexuality from their families and the Feds, their everyday lives become suspect in a way that is increasingly terrifying and unjust.

## SHADOW GAME by EEFJE BLANKEVOORT, ELS VAN DRIEL

Many of them call it 'the game': the journey along the Balkan route into western Europe. For the teenage boys we meet in Shadow Game, it is a way to keep themselves motivated. There are different games: the train game, the container game, the walking game. 'It's a mission', SK (15) from Afghanistan says. 'If you complete it, you win the game.' And if you fail, you will try again next time. There really is no other option.

"Shadow Game" brings us very close to the many unaccompanied minors trying to find protection in Europe. The disarming Hammoudi (14) from Syria tells us about the time he was stopped by masked policemen in Croatia. We see Yaseen (17) from Pakistan, carrying a little cat he found and shares his food with. For all of them, and the other boys in the film, the emotional and physical impact of what they're going through is severe. Still, many retain a youthful, innocent optimism. Warm, human and truly beautiful.

Event: The film will be accompanied by a conversation on Danish asylum policies and the current situation of border controls.

## LA CITA (THE APPOINTMENT) by ALEX KANNAN

## AT THE END OF EVIN by MEHDI TORAB-BEIGI, MOHAMMAD TORAB-BEIGI

Despite state restrictions, Iranian cinema internationally obtains critical acclaim for great storytelling, aesthetics and new genres. Duo directors Mohammad and Mehdi Tarab's "At the End of Evin" is another great example of it. Amin is an underprivileged trans person, desperate to undergo gender reassignment, who ends up being entrapped in a circle of deception woven by the rich and well connected, Nasir. The plan is Nasir will arrange and pay for Amin's transition as a woman in return Amin agrees to role-play as his daughter Annie to inherit the grandmother's house. As the deal comes into effect, a lot more complicated and wicked realities unfold.

This film takes us into a journey of desperation, exploitation and sacrifice seen and felt through the eyes of the protagonist and gives us an idea about how exactly transgender lives matter to the cis-gender world.

Over the past decade a large number political queer feminist film and art festivals have emerged through the underground activism and the whole idea of these festivals is to celebrate the unheard diversity, creating safe(r) spaces and representation of minoritized groups. Aks International Minorities Festival is part of a festivals network from South West Asian and North African (S.W.A.N.A), queer film festivals including Pink Life Queer Fest Turkey, Mawjoudin Queer Film Festival, Tunisia and Kooz-Aswat's queer film festival, Palestine.

This short film programme is co-curated in cooperation with the queer film festivals from the S.W.A.N.A region.

From childhood on, trans existences are pushed to face transphobia in the mangle of gender norms. Later in their lives, their processes are being tested by the prejudices and ostracism led by the same mentality.

## PRIDE & PROTEST BLAISE SINGH

Year: 2020, Duration: 90 min, Country: UK, Language: English with English subtitles In collaboration with Cph pride, Aks festival presents a documentary about QTIPOC communities and activists in Britain and their struggles surrounding the politics of desire, self-care, and found family. In the wake of the Birmingham protests against LGBTIQ+ relationship education in primary schools, director Blaise Singh follows various queer people of colour as they challenge homophobia and racism in their communities. They speak out against internalised shame and lack of representation.

Pride & Protest works on a level of activism and the united aims of inclusivity by Rainbow Films to show the presence and visibility of queer people of colour. The film itself illuminates their thoughts and activism, images of black and brown bodies at UK Black Pride celebrates alongside empowering personal narratives.

their neighborhood streets in Lahore, and take an intimate look at the kinship, beliefs, pleasure, and economies that drive these performances.

The main idea of the Fellowship was to bring talented filmmakers together and produce films that focus on Inclusion, representation and diversity. The producer of these films, Olomopolo Media, has always been a\$ great support to Aks festival in Pakistan in terms of hosting events, mentoring trans\* and queer individuals, creating jobs for the minorities and producing content to create public awareness. Aks festival has chosen some short films from Char Chaukay Bees (4x4=20) to showcase during the World Pride 2021 in Copenhagen.

When a young girl comes out to her biased psychiatrist in 1983, he calls her parents for an intervention to cure her.




